What is a Faith Promise?

You will hear the term “Faith Promise” quite a bit this month. Our church has two separate budgets; one covers our ministries, like Keepers of True Faith, salaries and building expenses. The missionary budget is separate and goes specifically to missionaries and Christian outreach organizations, locally, throughout the US and overseas. For instance, monthly support goes to Word Radio serving New England, Campus Crusaders in Arizona, Bible for Believers in Central Africa, Word of Life in Europe, Missionary Air Group in Honduras and ABWE in Peru.

Pledging, or what we call a Faith Promise, for the upcoming year, allows the Missionary Committee to prayerfully create a budget for 2022 and commit to donating to specific missionaries and organizations monthly. The amount pledged is whatever God is leading you to give. The amount will only be recorded, if you ask, by way of tithe envelopes, for your tax records.

Include in boxes: toys, personal toiletry items, crayons, pencils, paper, socks and such. Add a "Wow" item! Something like a doll, beading kit, ball or other spectacular item. No war toys, candy or toothpaste.

The message of Salvation in the child's own language will be added. Boxes are delivered throughout the world to children in need. In many areas a weekly Bible study is then offered.

We will also be assembling boxes here! There is a large collection box in the foyer to drop loose items you would like to donate; crayons, paper, pencils, pencil sharpeners, wash clothes, hair accessories, combs and small toys. Or the much needed "Wow" item!
