

True Memorial Baptist Church 75 Missions' Conference! Facing a Task Unfinished

Missionaries that serve throughout the world, are supported by donations. We as a church family commit each year to donating, or pledging, to help support a number of missionaries. Gifts are also given in times of need or for projects throughout the year. On the weekly prayer sheet (in the foyer) there is a list of missionaries we currently support as a church family.

Because this group of Missionaries are supported and prayed for, the Gospel has been shared with college students in AZ, Muslim's in Europe, people coming to this country, not knowing the language, to children in summer camps. Christian children's curriculum has been written, women in crisis with an unexpected pregnancy have received counseling, medical and financial help, the hungry have been fed, Christian radio is available throughout much of New England, people in remote areas in jungles now have access to medical and dental care, emergency flights and regularly hear about Christ.

Bibles have been translated and churches are being planted from Peru and Guatemala to Boston, new missionaries are being trained and sent out.

In many cases the missionaries are risking all. Dangerous areas, limited medical resources, political upheaval and in some cases their lives and freedom are threatened for sharing Christ's message of forgiveness and love.

True Memorial has two budgets: Current – heat, electricity, maintenance, salaries, insurance, plowing, etc. and then we have Missions- Missions is what is used for supporting Missionaries. At the end of 2022 the Missions Committee will prayerfully consider what has been pledged, and create a budget for 2023 for supporting missionaries and missions' organizations.

Throughout the month of October we invite missionaries to share and give updates. Pledge Cards will be out then. You will have the opportunity to let the Missions Committee know if you would like to donate towards missions in the year 2023.

Operation Christmas Child

Include in boxes: toys, personal toiletry items (toothbrushes, combs, wash cloths) crafts supplies, kits, crayons, pencils, paper, socks and such. Add a "Wow" item! Something like a doll, beading kit, ball, backpack or other spectacular item. (No war toys, candy, liquids or toothpaste.)

The message of Salvation in the child's own language will be added. Boxes are delivered throughout the world to children in need. In many areas a weekly Bible study is then offered. Shoe boxes will be collected the beginning of November.
